

Heidi Ho BAS Program Statement of Admissions

What is BAS?

Heidi Ho BAS (Before and After School) Program was started from the visions of a group of Heidi Ho parents whose children had graduated and were moving on to grade school. These parents had used our Extended Day program throughout the preschool/ kindergarten years and needed the quality, Christ-centered, Bible-based care to continue as their children grew up in a different school system. Heidi Ho is proud to provide BAS to past Heidi Ho students and their siblings ages 5-10 years old.

Transportation

The Heidi Ho bus picks up at Island City School, Central, Greenwood and GRA. Imbler students will be picked up at their bus stop at the Faith Center in Island City. Busing is included in the hourly rate.

Hours of Operation

Heidi Ho provides BAS service **AFTER** school until 5:30 PM Monday-Friday. We are also able to provide care all day (7-5:30) during **SOME** of your school's scheduled closures. Heidi Ho will close at 4:00 on the first Tuesday of every month for Staff Enrichment. Some Heidi Ho closures are different than the school district so it is highly recommended that you compare school calendars to avoid any confusion. La Grande School District: Before school care and busing to school WILL be provided on Late Start Wednesdays ONLY.

Imbler School District: Busing and BAS will NOT be provided on the first Tuesday of the month due to early closure for Staff Enrichment. Busing and BAS WILL be provided on Friday afternoons.

Cove/Union School Districts: BAS WILL be provided all day Fridays.

Charges and Fees

There is a \$75 registration fee to join the BAS program. This fee helps provide busing, materials and supplies for activities and daily snacks. The charge for BAS is \$4.20/hour (\$3.75/hour for GRA students). Monthly charges are added to the following month's bill. There is a late pick-up fee of \$30/15 minutes after 5:30 pm.

Payment Options

ACH and credit/debit payments can be made through  [brightwheel](#). Cash, check and credit/debit payments are also accepted in the Heidi Ho office. Payment drop boxes are located in the gymnasium and at the office. Payments are due on the 1st of the month but by the 15th in which case a late payment fee may be added to your account. If you are experiencing financial difficulty and are unable to make a payment on time, please contact the office for payment options. When an account becomes 30 days overdue, without contact from the payer, Heidi Ho services may be discontinued. If no action is taken at that point, your account may be sent to collections.

Student Behavioral Responsibilities

Facility safety (Keep an orderly, clean environment. Personal property will be well cared for and will not create unnecessary temptation to others. Do not damage or deface church/school property. Students will be responsible for replacement or repair of damaged property.)

Dress Student clothing must be modest and honoring to the Lord Jesus. If apparel is deemed inappropriate by school administration, it will be called to the parent's attention.
Clothes should be appropriate for the function and occasion.
Clothing must not display any inappropriate words or images.
No spaghetti straps or bare midriffs. Skirts and dresses need to be accompanied by shorts or leggings.

Personal Gum is not allowed at school.
Cell phones, electronic games, and personal media players should not be brought to school.
